CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

St Anthony's School is a Catholic co-educational primary school currently comprising approximately 477 students from Kindergarten to Year 6 (Double stream to Year Six), with a triple stream Year 4, serving the Parish Community of St Anthony of Padua, Wanneroo.

Both a strong physical and spiritual connection between school and parish is promoted and developed by all members of the two communities. The school plays an active role in the Sacramental programs run by the parish throughout the year.

St Anthony's School also operates a 3 Year Old Kindergarten Program and a Playgroup. Before and after school care services are available onsite through OSHClub.

We value our community and realise the importance of working collaboratively to develop the next leaders and active contributors of our community. We offer several extracurricular activities including camp, excursions, an extensive sport program and various before and after school sporting and music opportunities.

St Anthony's provides an education that emphasises the individual growth of each child in the school via a wide range of learning opportunities with specialist teachers in the areas of Science, Music, Physical Education, Visual Art and Languages (Italian). The school also offers and promotes a Gifted and Talented Program centred in the middle to upper primary classes.

Literacy and numeracy intervention programs of Reading Recovery and EMU (Extending Mathematical Understanding) are an integral part of the curriculum offered in the junior primary. Technology is embedded within classroom practice across all year levels and as an integral component of literacy and numeracy learning.

Non-attendance is followed up in several ways...

- Parents of students who know they will be absent in advance must complete a leave form to signify days
 that the student will be absent and are required to collect work for the period from their teacher(s).
 Parents are responsible for following up this work with their child.
- Reminder forms are sent out to parents who do not send in an absentee note.
- Follow up is conducted by Assistant Principals at various times during each term. Normally a phone call or meeting for parents who do not comply.
- Principal conducts interview with parent to determine issue. Resolution is determined and acted on.
- Letters detailing absentee information to parents whose children attend less than 90% each semester.

SATISFACTION

Communication between the School (teachers and administration), parents and students takes place continually. The school administration and class teachers are in constant contact with parents and vice versa regarding issues that may arise or have arisen during the school year.

Surveys are conducted from time to time for students, parents and staff. The responses indicate that a very high majority of the three cohorts believe that the school meets and exceeds the needs of the students at the school.

The Quality Catholic School Framework also has a focus on the satisfaction of stakeholders.

It is acknowledged that a significant proportion of new parents who attend our school do so on the recommendation of parents currently within our school.
